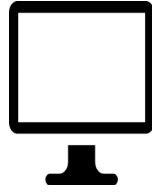


On an average day in NHS Wales...

Over **9,000** web visits and enquiries are made to NHS Direct Wales



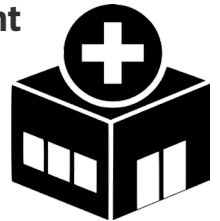
Over **800** calls are made to NHS Direct Wales

NHS Wales

NHS Wales delivers services through seven Local Health Boards and three NHS Trusts.

Health Boards are responsible for planning and securing the delivery of primary, community and secondary care services alongside specialist services for their areas. These services include dental, optical, pharmacy and mental health services.

There are three **NHS Trusts** in Wales with an all-Wales focus:

- **Public Health Wales NHS Trust** provides professional, independent public health advice and services
- **Velindre NHS Trust** provides a range of specialist services, including the Welsh Blood Service and Velindre Cancer Centre
- The **Welsh Ambulance Service NHS Trust** provides pre-hospital emergency care and treatment throughout Wales.
