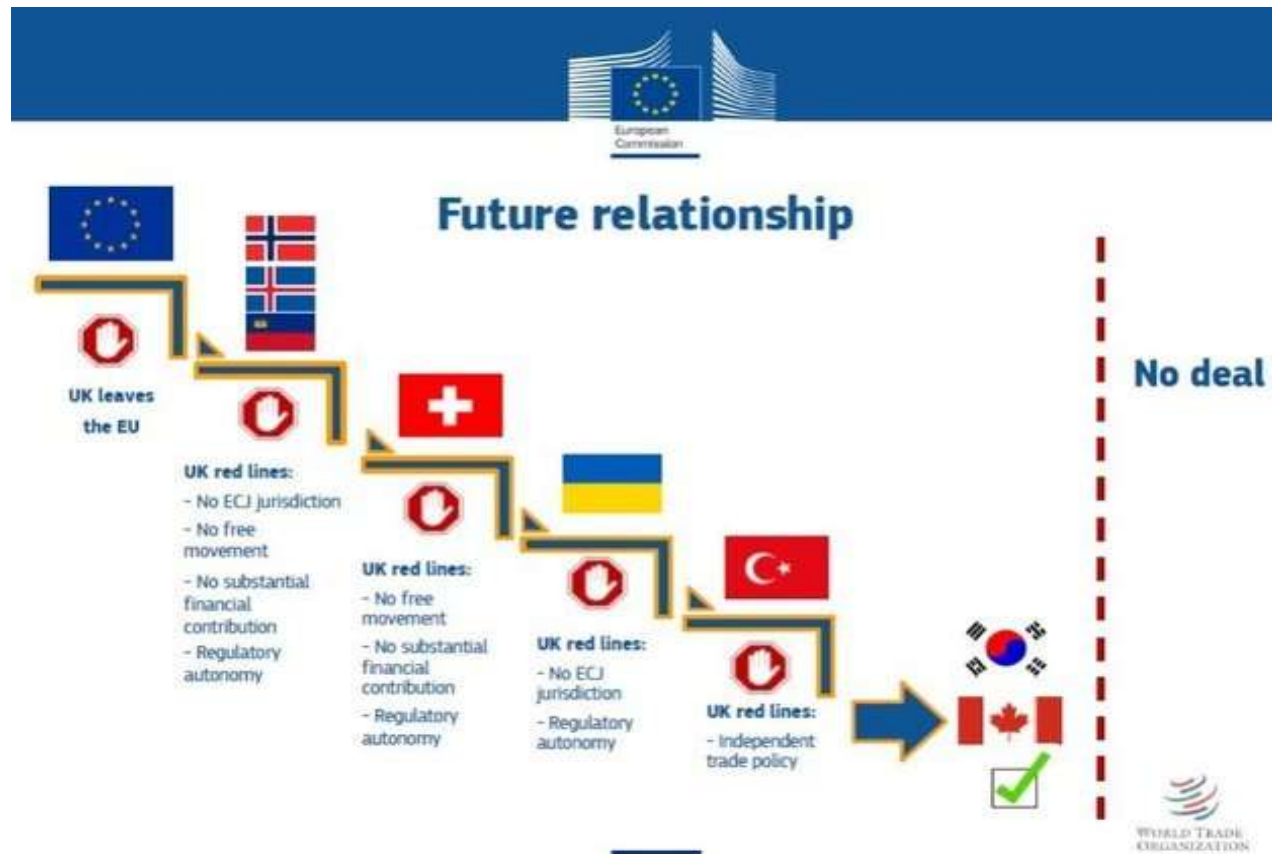


The UK leaving the EU will have significant implications for patients and the public

- (3) How will a smooth transition be ensured so that patient safety is affected the least?



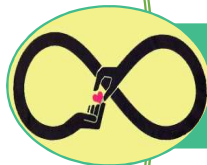
5 Key Asks

EU27 and UK health professionals should continue to benefit from mutually beneficial training and education opportunities, automatic recognition of their qualifications, and continue to provide healthcare services to EU27 and UK patients
