Ask me how St John volunteers have supported the NHS

- Over 30,000 trained volunteers, over 1.2m hours of volunteering
 - > Ambulance response 900+ trained crew, 150 ambulances
 - Hospital volunteering 30+ hospital trusts
 - Community support blood donations, nighttime economy, falls, homeless
 - ➤ Vaccination programme 26,500 volunteers trained

Ambulances

Additional capacity, see/treat and discharge, supporting faster response

> Hospitals

Over 22,000 shifts, clinical observations, support triage, helping with discharge/transfer

Vaccination

➤ Over 130,000 shifts, reducing need for staff (1m hours of clinician time), trained vaccinators
