









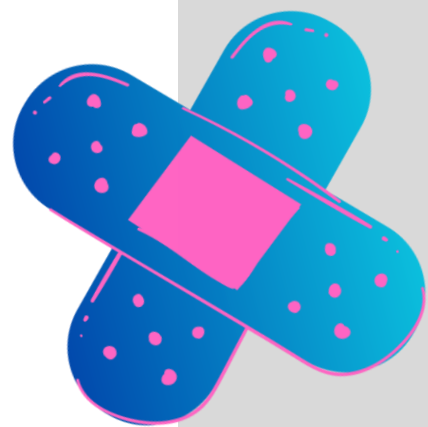


Future Workforce

Direct entry onto financially supported qualifications through apprenticeships



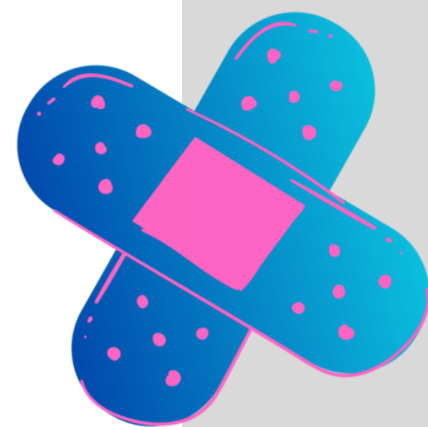
Appropriate qualifications, taught by health and care professionals



Opportunities for health and care staff to become accredited teachers



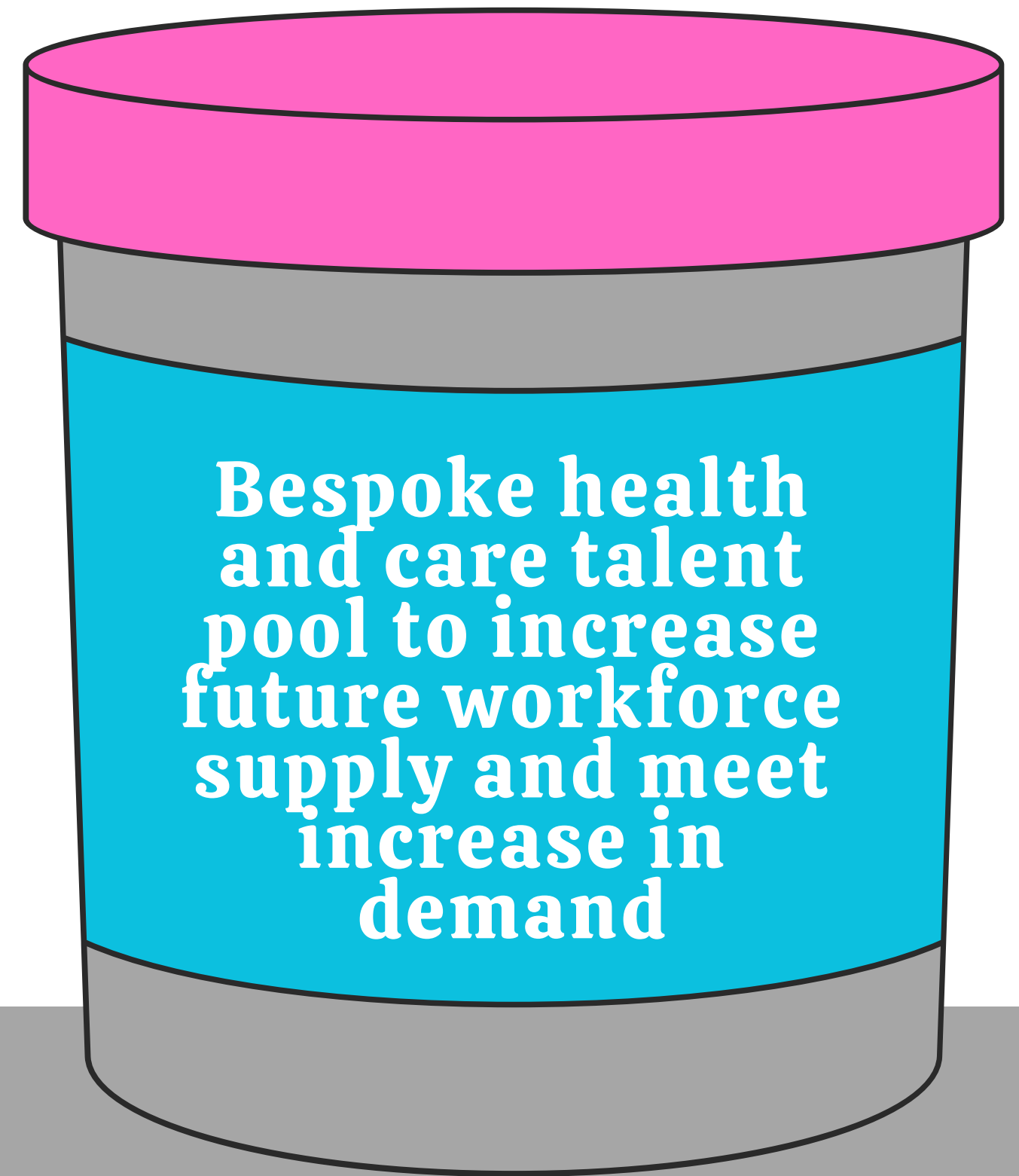
Promote awareness of less-favoured or less understood roles and sectors



Opportunity to earn as they learn due to practical skills acquired during education

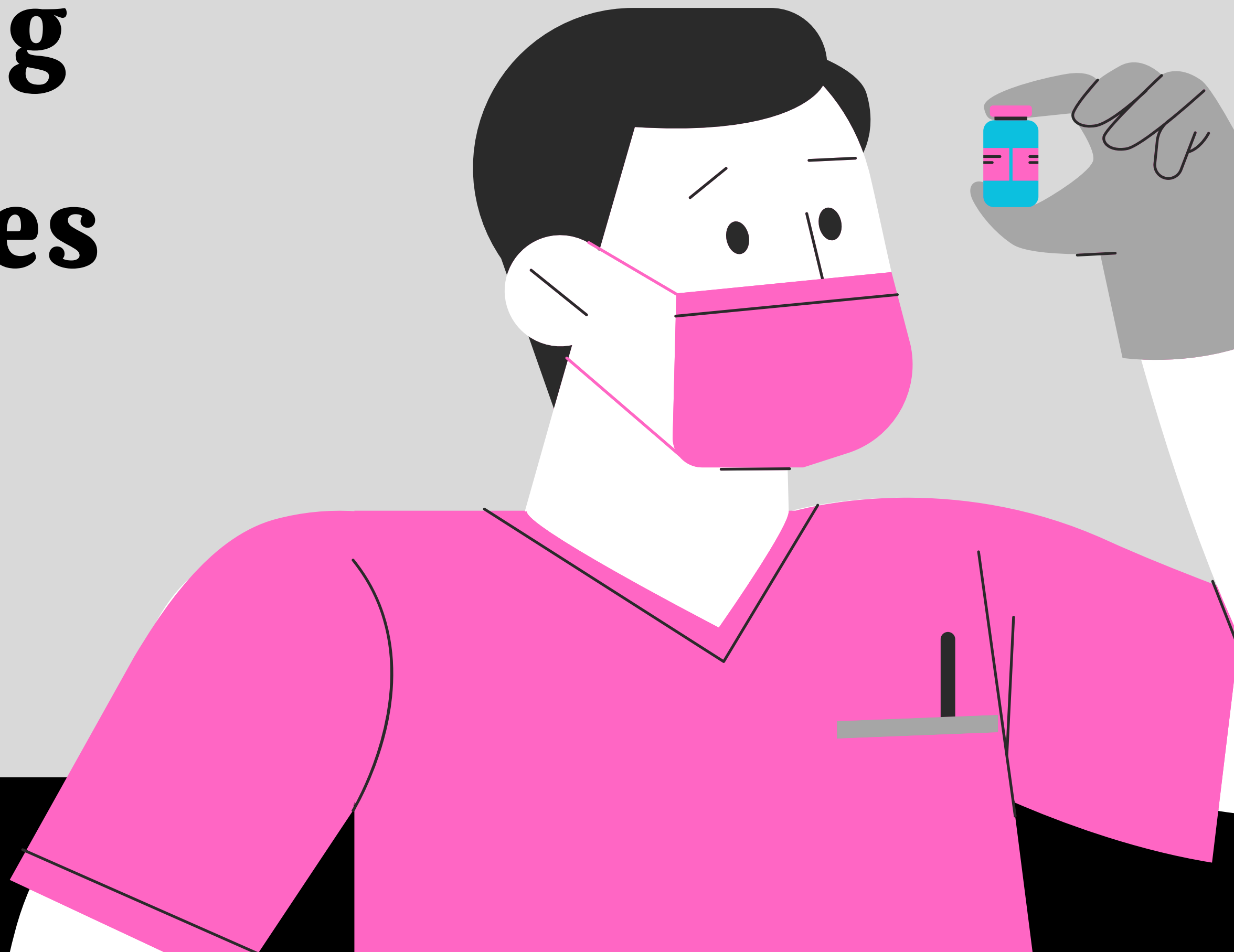
