Focus on people and the places where they live and work

People

Focus on getting the best outcomes for the shared communities you serve

Ensure joint community engagement is purposeful, ongoing and acknowledges the diversity of perspectives

Build on what works for local people; adding value, revising and improving only where necessary

Place

Make place the starting point for all devolution discussions

Develop place-based strategic approaches which commit local partners to joint policies and working

Be smarter with spatial understanding and what you can collectively do

Step 02:

Support populations to improve their own health

Partnership

Create the capacity. resource and time necessary to fully embed this at all levels

Be transparent about the **ICS-devo** partnerships and who you work with and why, including who benefits and how

Prioritise shared data about public services and populations as a key enabler to unlocking the potential

Focus explicitly on both health in all policies and health policy in determining what is best needed to support and empower communities

Do not wait for permission from government and NHS England to use existing powers

Ensure proposals for future devo deals involve health and build on developments that are long term, evidence based and multi-sector

Support a better shared understanding of the strategic financing and funding of place

Change the nature of the local fiscal conversation

Reframe the approach taken to business case appraisals and guidance development

Process

Make mission, values and behaviours the critical local building blocks
