

P5 Transformation in primary care | Supported by Optum

Primary care is under extraordinary strain. With excessive service pressures, rising demand, and a high-profile contractual dispute placing unprecedented stress on GPs and their teams - and indeed across the wider system - these challenges are being felt acutely as we head into the winter months. However, in this difficult context, opportunities are emerging: to build on existing innovations, to roll out the next phase of multidisciplinary teams, and to invest in a new neighbourhood care model - all focused on reimagining services for the future. How do we build on these opportunities against the current backdrop?




